

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

We are so excited to kick off our 24/25 theatre season with *Trap*! This play is unlike any you've ever witnessed. I had toyed with the idea of tackling a documentary-style play for a while, but when this opportunity came about this past spring, it really piqued my interest. A high school play about a high school play? And it's based entirely upon interviews and recordings? At my core, I am (and always will be) just another theatre kid, but I am now an adult with a career that encourages me to explore my creativity; I decided we had to try the meta-theatre. And, boy, am I glad we did.

Beyond the obvious event it recounts, *Trap* is a play about a community's response to tragedy, and how powerfully fear can affect generation after generation. It is about the importance of listening to people, not just hearing them. Accounts from witnesses, first responders and survivors of an event that changed a community weave a story of perseverance in the pursuit of truth. It is also about how quickly an unforgiving news cycle can move on to the next sensation, forgetting entirely about the stories that captivated its audiences for days, and the people who lived them. We hope that you find this performance unforgettable.

Character Death: While there is no graphic violence depicted, there is mention of the death of three characters (including a child), and one character who dies onstage.
